### Why choose this program?

You will receive a hands-on education across various formats, including high definition video, and will have access to a state of the art cinema. You will learn how to work in a team to bring visions to life on the screen, as well as gain a thorough grounding in the history, practice and critical analysis of film.

You will have the choice of electives in editing, producing, cinematography, directing and production design, among many others. You will also take courses in screen production and screen distribution, which will help you learn about finding support and audiences for your screen production work.

Your academic studies will be enhanced by regular exposure to national and international artists-in-residence working in different areas of film and screen media production, as well as a supervised work placement.

The Bachelor of Film and Screen Media Production program is offered full-time and on-campus at South Bank.

#### Student Income Support

To be classed as a full-time student, you are required to enrol in a minimum number of credit points each standard study period. The minimum credit points for full-time enrolment in this program is 30 credit points.

Trimester 1 and Trimester 2 are deemed standard study periods. As Trimester 3 is a non-standard study period, continuing students moving from one year to the next will not be required to study during this trimester to be eligible for student income support.

Domestic students who commence in Trimester 3 may be eligible for student income support from the onset of study provided they are enrolled full-time in this study period.

### **Commonwealth supported students**

### **Fee-paying undergraduate (domestic) students**
