### Degree requirements: Students who started Trimester 2 - 2019

#### For Domestic and those International students not required to complete the English Language Enhancement course

For the award of *Bachelor of Asian Studies (BAsSt)*, you must successfully complete 240 credit points, made up of the core courses AND

- two 60 credit point majors;
- 20 credit points of Listed electives;
- 20 credit points of free-choice electives.

#### For International students required to complete the English Language Enhancement course

For the award of *Bachelor of Asian Studies (BAsSt)*, you must successfully complete 240 credit points, made up of the core courses AND

- 10 credit points for the English Language Enhancement course (5904LHS);
- two 60 credit point majors;
- 20 credit points of Listed electives;
- 10 credit points of free-choice electives.

#### Other program requirements

You must successfully complete:

- no more than 100 credit points of Level 1 courses (the first digit of a course code denotes the level);
- at least 60 credit points of Level 3 courses or higher.

This degree/s may be awarded **with Distinction** where a student achieves a minimum program GPA of 6.5 with no failed courses. The words 'This award was achieved with Distinction' will be recorded on the testamur and will appear below the conferral date of the award.
