This program is available to Domestic and International students at the South Bank campus. The program offered at the Australian National Academy of Music (ANAM) in Melbourne is available to Domestic students only.

The program will be offered full-time or part-time to Griffith University students.

Students applying through the Australian National Academy of Music (ANAM) will be offered full-time enrolment only.

Attendance will be on-campus at QCGU South Bank campus and/or at ANAM South Melbourne campus.

The course Music Production and Presentation will be offered through blended learning approaches incorporating face-to-face contact and online tasks. Supervision will similarly take place through face-to-face sessions and on-line engagement. For ANAM students, a proportion of coursework and supervision for the program will be accounted for within ANAM extant learning and teaching activities.

Student Income Support

To be classed as a full-time student, you are required to enrol in a minimum number of credit points each standard study period. The minimum credit points for full-time enrolment in this program is 30 credit points.

Trimester 1 and Trimester 2 are deemed standard study periods. As Trimester 3 is a non-standard study period, continuing students moving from one year to the next will not be required to study during this trimester to be eligible for student income support.

Domestic students who commence in Trimester 3 may be eligible for student income support from the onset of study provided they are enrolled full-time in this study period.
