Can I apply?

Admission requirements

To be eligible for admission to the **Master of Interactive Media**, applicants must:

- hold a Bachelor degree in any discipline from a recognised University or another tertiary education institution of equivalent standing
- **OR** hold a Bachelor degree (or higher) in a related discipline from a recognised tertiary institution - these students will be eligible for 40 credit points of advanced standing
- **OR** hold a Bachelor Honours degree or a Graduate Diploma (or higher) in a related discipline from a recognised tertiary institution - these students will be eligible for 80 credit points of advanced standing
- **OR** have a combination of alternative admission criteria such as formal, informal and non-formal learning deemed to be equivalent to either of the above - these students may be eligible for 10 to 80 credit points of advanced standing
- **AND** provide a brief personal statement of 2-3 paragraphs outlining:
 1. Why you want to study a Master of Interactive Media and
 2. A description of the research and/or practical projects that you would like to undertake during the study with reference to the courses and topics in the program that attract your interest.

What is the application process?

How to apply

An International student is a person who is not an Australian or New Zealand citizen or an Australian permanent resident or holder of an Australian Permanent Humanitarian visa.

This program is available to International students for **study in Australia at Griffith University**.

International students applying to study on-campus in Australia will require a student visa or another type of visa which does not preclude them from studying in Australia.

You can apply for admission **online** (where you will be required to upload your supporting documentation and pay an AUD\$50 non-refundable fee) OR via a Griffith University **registered agent**.

What are the language requirements?

Language requirements

English language requirements apply to International applicants and other applicants whose previous study was undertaken in a language other than English. The minimum English language requirements for such applicants for entry to this program are as follows:

- A minimum overall band score of 6.5 on IELTS (Academic) with no sub-score of less than 6.0
- OR a minimum score of 575 on TOEFL
- OR an internet-based (iBT) TOEFL score of 79 (no sub-score less than 19)
- OR no score less than 3+ in each skill of the ISLPR (conducted by ISLPR Language Services only)
- OR a minimum overall score of 176 (no score less than 169) on C1 Advanced (formerly Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English) **or** C2 Proficiency (formerly Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English)
- OR an overall score of 58 in the Pearson Test of English (Academic) with no score less than 50.

English test results must be no more than two years old.

Students who successfully complete the **Direct Entry Program (DEP)** will satisfy the English Language requirements for this Griffith degree.

Additional credit information

Students with a Bachelor degree in a related discipline from a recognised tertiary institution will be eligible for up to 40 credit points of credit towards the Masters program.

Students with a Bachelor Honours degree or a Graduate Diploma in a related discipline from a recognised tertiary institution will be eligible for up to 80 credit points of credit towards the Masters program.
